## Carbon Tax, Alcohol prices...and MP salaries all go up today.

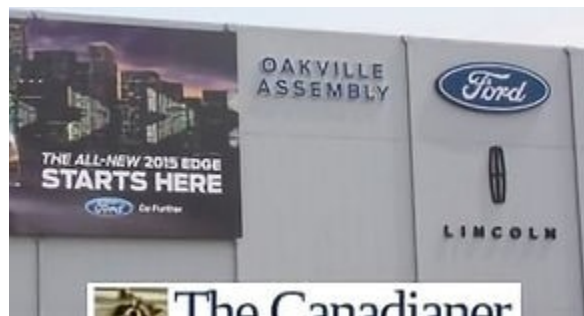


Ottawa -
