Covid tests not warranted says country that gave us Covid.



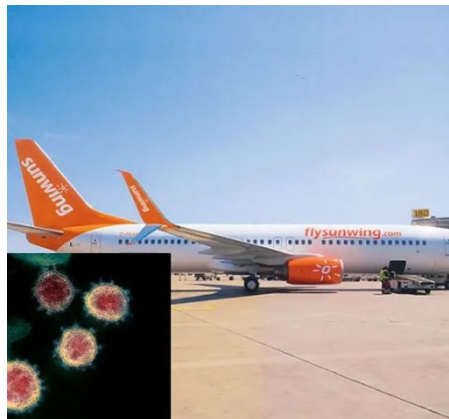
